Opening/Centering

Approval of board minutes from the June meeting

Treasurer's report

- \$19,955.93 current balance. Not all of the Climate Change Conference funds/expenditures have been included.
- All credit card charges need to have receipts available for Karen. The monthly statement does not describe the actual charges well enough for the accounting report.
- The event co-sponsored with the Bagaduce Watershed Association (BWA) raised \$92.00 in donations. It is not clear how the money should be shared in co-sponsored events. Since most of the work was done by BWA it was decided that the donated funds should go to them, minus the \$25.00 RFS building use fee.

The board discussed the role of being a sponsor and what does sponsorship mean?

Decision: It was decided that it was appropriate for the RFS board to clarify its role as a sponsor and make explicit agreements based upon each event. One RFS representative must work the organization co-sponsoring the event and the board must be informed of these events. Our mission encourages community partnerships and the Program team is encouraged to continue their role in organizing and approving co-sponsored events, but the Board should be informed. Guidelines could be developed for co-sponsors in need of event planning guidance.

Action: Daksha will develop a guideline template for the board to review. The program team will inform the board on sponsored events that were agreed on.
